Asked by Miss C Burch MLA:

In relation to:

MISS C BURCH: The transport journey planner, is this something that the government is developing in-house or engaging a third party to develop a new app?

Ms Thomas: We are a little hesitant because we are doing it in-house. We have someone in the team who is specifically looking at that, but we are also engaging with a contractor to help provide that. So it is a bit of both is the answer.

MISS C BURCH: Yes, that is fine. And so has that third-party provider already been engaged and was a tender—

Ms Thomas: Yes. Yes.

MISS C BURCH: And was a tender put out for that process?

Mr Edghill: Yes, I think we would have to take that on notice. I just do not know to hand the value of the work and what process it went through.

MISS C BURCH: Okay, thank you.

Ms Meegan Fitzharris MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:—

The Territory issued a select Request for Quote (RFQ) in May 2018, to contract a preferred vendor to build and implement a new web based Journey Planner. It was sent to multiple developers. All responses were reviewed by the Evaluation Team, and SkedGo were deemed the best value for money option. The Territory and SkedGo entered in to a contract in August 2018 for Stage 1 development, to the value of \$78,290 inc GST. We are currently finalising the on-going Software Licence Agreement (SLA) from December 2018 to June 2019 for the value of \$42,721 inc GST.
