In relation to: Official Visitors for Disability Services (OVDS) CSD Annual Reports 2019–20 page 85.

- Can the Minister provide a copy of the register of visitable places for the OVDS as an attachment to the answer to this Question on Notice? If not, how many visitable places are contained on this register for the OVDS?
- 2 Due to COVID-19 restrictions, phone calls to houses and service providers were made instead of face-to-face visits. How many calls were made to:
- a. Households
- b. Service providers

Emma Davidson MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:–

A copy of the register of visitable places for the OVDS has not been provided as it contains living in community accommodation. private information relating to the personal addresses of vulnerable people with disabilities

The register contains 266 Visitable Places as at 17 March 2021.

(a and b) During the 2019-20FY the OVDS visited 573 entitled residents through 278 visits to continued to be conducted in relation to serious complaint issues. contact primarily maintained with houses by telephone and email, face-to-face visits Visitable Places. While regular face-to-face visits ceased during the Covid-19 pandemic with

specific focus on Covid-19 management during that quarter. continued to maintain contact with houses and providers through regular phone calls, with a From April to June 2020, the OVDS reported that they had resumed some visiting but Follow-up calls were also made to a number of service providers if issues were identified During the January to March quarter, the OVDS reported 55 phone calls made to houses
