Mr Michael Harris, Auditor-General: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: –

The ACT Audit Office (ACT AO) has not changed its budget decisions by applying the wellbeing impact assessment or the gender analysis tool. The ACT AO's mandate is to promote public accountability for the effective and efficient provision of ACT public services by providing independent evidence-based audit reports to the ACT Legislative Assembly and the ACT Community. The ACT AO's budget ensures that the ACT AO delivers audits and other services to the ACT Legislative Assembly, including the delivery of a performance audit program, widely consulted on annually, that responds to emerging issues of importance to the ACT Legislative Assembly and broader community.
