 - 1. Funding for native fish stocking (Murray Cod and Golden Perch) in ACT's lakes and ponds.
 - 2. Funing to address invasive fish species such as European Carp and English Perch (Redfin).
 - 3. Funding to restore and enhance native fish habitat in ACT's waterways.

Comment 1. Murray Cod and Golden perch do not beed succesfully in the artifical environment of ACT's urban ponds. Stocking of juvenile fish is required to maintain viable populations of these species. Funding has declined significantly in recent years which puts at risk the local populations of these iconic but vulnerable native fish. Current stocking comes from "left over" funding from Parks, Conservation and Lands as well as small amounts raised by local fishing clubs. Dedicated, secure funding is needed.

- 2. Invasive, non-native species such as European Carp and Redfin have detrimental impacts on native fish populations. CRFA would like to see programs funded to assist in control of pest fish species (noting that rabbit and certain weed control programs have been funded).
- 3. Land clearing on construction of urban ponds has lead to relatively barren habitats for native fish species. CRFA would like to see a program funded to reintroduce native fish habitat into ACT's urban ponds to increase their carrying capacity for native species.

Funding for action in these 3 areas would go a long way in revesing the dominance of invasive pest species, improving the situation for our native species and enhancing the overall quality of the aquatic environment.

Yes No Comment CRFA have been advised by PCL staff that their budget submission for fish stocking and carp reduction was not funded. CRFA worked closely with PCL, TAMS, National Capital Authority staff as well as scientists, researchers and MDBA staff to develop the PCL submission and were disappointed that it was not funded.

6. What are your views on the Budget in relation to your priority areas listed in question three? Comment CRFA welcomes funding in the budget to address issues relating to the aquatic environment, such as Invasive Weed Control, Restoration of Waterways and Surrounds and the Molonglo Riverside Park planning, but would like to see more direct action to improve native fish numbers and native fish habitat and to address invasive fish species in ACT's waterways.

The number and variety of waterways within the ACT are greatly underutilised due to poor water quality and the dominance on undesirable invasive species. The CRFA believes that investment to address and improve ACTs waterways for native species has the potential to be returned many times over to the region, not only in terms of improvement to the overall health of the aquatic environment, but also in realising the untapped potential of the region as a recreational fishing destination of choice.
