

PROPOSAL FOR "STUDY TRAVEL" BY NON-EXECUTIVE MEMBER

The Remuneration Tribunal has determined that non-Executive members are entitled to financial assistance with travel for the purposes of undertaking studies or investigations of matters related to his or her duties and responsibilities as a Member ("study travel").

Chapter 15 of the Members' Guide sets out procedures for members to access this entitlement that the Standing Committee on Administration and Procedure has endorsed. The process involves:

- the member completing a "study travel proposal" and lodging that proposal with the Secretariat's Corporate Services Office; and
- the Corporate Services Office providing advice to the Speaker on the proposal and on the member's available entitlement.

Members should note that approval to utilise this entitlement cannot be sought retrospectively.

Study Trip Report

Fact Finding Visits to the New South Wales and Queensland Governments in relation to the Exposure Draft on Retirement Villages Bill 2010.

On the 28/01/2011 I visited the office of the Ms Virginia Judge MP, in her capacity as the Minister for Fair Trading, in the former New South Wales (NSW) Government. I met with her Senior Advisers and Departmental staff in relation to the NSW Retirement Villages Legislation and the recent consultations and changes that have occurred in that jurisdiction.

I also discussed the recent Productivity Commissions' draft report and recent push for harmonisation of State and Territory legislation in relation to retirement villages.

On 10/02/2011, I visited the Hon Peter Lawlor MP, the former Queensland Minister for Fair Trading, his Senior Advisers and Departmental staff in relation to the Queensland Retirement Villages Legislation and recent developments as mentioned above in relation to my visit to NSW.

The information gathered from these visits, and subsequent material that has been provided to me by these state governments is invaluable in the continued development of my Exposure Draft on Retirement Villages Bill 2010.
