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#### **New questions**

- (1) How many Dhulwa staff have been on WorkCover each year since the unit opened and can the Minister provide detail including staff occupation, reason for WorkCover, the length of leave, etc.
- (2) Further to the answer to a question taken on notice on 21 February 2022 (QToN No 11), can the Minister provide detail about the 'OV physical' incidents since 2019-20 including what happened in each incident, staff occupation, how was the staff member injured and what action was taken (eg, staff taken to hospital, staff treated at the scene, staff took leave).
- (3) How many Dhulwa staff have taken stress/mental health leave each year since the unit opened and in what roles were the staff (eg, mental health nurses, security).
- (4) How many staff complaints have there been each year since the unit opened, and can the Minister provide details of each complaint, staff occupation and what/if any action was taken.
- (5) What training do Dhulwa nurses receive to protect themselves from being physically attacked.

- (6) Can the Minister provide detail, for each year since the unit opened, about (a) how much time each year is allocated to each staff member for training, (b) how much has been spent on training, (c) what training has been offered and by whom and (d) how many staff have attended training programs.
- (7) How many nurses are meant to work each shift and on how many occasions, since 2019, has Dhulwa been short staffed.
- (8) Further to part (7), who is the leader for each shift and is that nurse also required to work with consumers.
- (9) Is there an Assistant Director of Nursing (ADON) or Director of Nursing (DON) on site at all times; if not, who is in charge.
- (10) Have any ADONs or DONs been physically attacked since Dhulwa opened; if so, what are the details of these attacks.
- (11) What extra training are ADONs and DONs required to attend.
- (12) Can the Minister provide details about what training ADONs and DONs have done since Dhulwa opened and what the cost was of that training.
- (13) What mental health support is provided to Dhulwa nurses.
- (14) Can the Minister provide details on how much funding has been allocated and spent on mental health support for nurses since the unit opened.
- (15) What is the accreditation process for Dhulwa and can the Minister provide details on this process.
- (16) Has there been an audit, or any review, of Dhulwa since it opened.
- (17) What safety issues have been raised by staff since Dhulwa opened and what was the response for each.
- (18) What has Dhulwa's budget been each year since it opened.
- (19) How much did it cost to build Dhulwa.
- (20) What has been the Dhulwa staff/nurse turnover since it opened.
- (21) How many Dhulwa nurses have sought and been offered counselling/psychological support each year since it opened, including details of each occasion.
- (22) Have any unfair dismissal claims been lodged by any Dhulwa staff; if so, can the Minister provide details of each claim.
- (23) Have Dhulwa nurses (a) had faeces thrown at them, (b) been sexually harassed or (c) threatened.
- (24) What is the total staff numbers at Dhulwa and can the Minister provide a breakdown of roles and permanent staff versus contract positions.
- (25) What has been the staff budget each year since the unit opened.

- (26) How often have security guards intervened in occupational violence and threatening situations for staff and can the Minister provide details of each situation.
- (27) What is the role of security guards and how many are employed for each shift.
- (28) Is it the job of security guards to protect Dhulwa staff/nurses.
- (29) Does Dhulwa have a resident doctor/psychiatrist; if so, can the Minister provide details.
- (30) What support staff does Dhulwa employ (eg, counsellors, psychologist, psychiatrists, OTs, music therapy, exercise therapy).
- (31) What programs have been offered to Dhulwa consumers since it opened including detail and cost (eg, cooking course, music program).

- (6) Can the Minister provide information, for the last three years, about how many staff (including their roles) have (a) received training, (b) the nature of the training, (c) the provider and (d) cost.
- (7) Do staff receive specific palliative care training when they are employed and each year; if so, can the Minister provide details of the training.
- (8) What has been the staff turnover at Clare Holland over the last five years.
- (9) Can the Minister provide details, for each year over the past five years, about what counselling/support is offered to staff and how often has it been taken up, including cost.

- (1) How many Sudden Cardiac Arrests (SCAs) have there been in government schools each year since 2016.

- (6) How much does an audit of new installations cost an ACT electrical company and what is the breakdown for each type of inspection and the cost.
- (7) How many defects has Access Canberra issued since 2016 from audits of new installations by inspection type.
- (8) What is the total revenue Access Canberra has received since 2016 from auditing new installations.
- (9) Can the Minister provide a breakdown of what/how many disciplinary actions have been taken against ACT companies in breach of legislation, including detail of each action.

- (11) Is the ACT Government responsible/liable if they do not identify a defect and this causes property damage.

# 728 MS CLAY: To ask the Treasurer—

- (1) How many dwellings are currently paying land tax in the ACT.
- (2) How many dwellings does the Government estimate may owe land tax but are not currently registered to pay it.
- (3) How does the ACT Government investigate whether a property should be paying land tax but currently is not.
- (4) What is the mean and median nominal yearly land tax payable for a dwelling in the ACT.
- (5) How many land tax exemptions were granted in the last 12 months and can a breakdown by category of exemption be provided.
- (6) When land tax is collected on properties, is the reason land tax is payable (eg, vacant, rented etc) collected; if so, could a table breaking down amount of dwellings by reason they are required to pay land tax be provided.

- 733 MS CLAY: To ask the Minister for Planning and Land Management—

  - (2) Can the Minister identify any blocks in the Western Edge Investigation Area that are currently on the market.
- 734 **MS CLAY**: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services—Can the Minister provide data on Transport Canberra's bus operator workforce by gender and employment category, broken down by the number of full-time, part-time and casual drivers, including whether they are male, female or other.
- 735 **MS CASTLEY**: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services—
  - (1) When did work start on the Gwydir Square upgrade in Kaleen and when is it scheduled to end.
  - (2) Can the Minister provide details on whether the work is on schedule.

- (4) Is there an intentional lag time in releasing the report; if so, why.
- (5) On what dates were the (a) Quarter 1, (b) Quarter 2, (c) Quarter 3 and (d) Quarter 4 reports published on Health's ACT Public Health Services Quarterly Performance Report webpage since 2015-16.
- (6) Can the Minister provide details on what the total cost of producing and publishing the report has been since 2015-16.

- (1) Can the Minister provide a list of all ACT Government run mental health services, including (a) how much funding each service received in 2020-21 and the forward estimates to 2024-25, (b) a link to a website or information about the service, (c) how many staff work at each service including their job title, employment type and workload and (d) how long the service has been operating and its initial cost.
- (2) Can the Minister provide a list of all mental health services the ACT Government has discontinued since 2016, including (a) how many staff worked at these services, (b) the type of service provided eg, step-up, step-down, recovery, preventative etc, (c) total funding each program received and (d) why each service was discontinued and what, if anything, replaced them.
- (3) Can the Minister provide a list of all services that are not run by the Government but receive ACT Government funding, including (a) how much funding each service receives and (b) the type of service they provide eg, step-up, step-down, recovery, preventative etc.

- (4) Do these facilities have any limits on who it can use a spit hood on.
- 745 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Assistant Minister for Families and Community Services—
  - (1) Does Bimberi maintain a stockpile of spit hoods; if so, how many does it have.
  - (2) In what situations would Bimberi staff use a spit hood.
  - (3) When was the last time Bimberi staff used a spit hood on a person.
  - (4) Do Bimberi staff have any restrictions on who a spit hood can be used on.
- 746 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Minister for Corrections—Is there a sterile perimeter (eg a buffer zone around the entire outward facing side of the perimeter fence in which only authorised personnel can enter) around the Alexander Maconochie Centre; if not, why not, and is a sterile perimeter being considered.
- 747 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Minister for Families and Community Services—When will the new wellbeing dashboard, raised in the Minister's progress update on the implementation of the ACT Children and Young People's Commitment 2015-2025, dated 6 April 2022, be available.

# 748 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Minister for Families and Community Services—

- (1) In relation to the Pilot of the Head Start program, raised in the Minister's progress update on the implementation of the ACT Children and Young People's Commitment 2015-2025, dated 6 April 2022, (a) when did the pilot of this program begin, and when is it expected to end, (b) what are the intended/desired outcomes, and how will these outcomes be assessed, (c) how many students are currently engaged in the program, (d) how were these students chosen and/or identified, (e) how many full-time equivalent staffing positions are currently being funded as part of this pilot and (f) what are the responsibilities of these staff.
- (2) In relation to the ACT Job Trainer program, raised in the Minister's progress update on the implementation of the ACT Children and Young People's Commitment 2015-2025, dated 6 April 2022, (a) when will the extension of the ACT Job Trainer program end, (b) what has been the actual demand, given the program provides 2,500 training places, (c) if demand has exceeded supply, is there any kind of waiting list; if so, how long is it, and (d) if demand has not matched supply, what steps has the ACT Government taken to promote this program.

- (1) Has the development application process begun for the new green waste facility for Belconnen; if so, when will a consultation and feedback platform be put up on the Yoursay website; if not, why not.
- (2) Did the development application process commence by early March as stated on the Transport Canberra and City Services website; if not, what was the cause of the delay.
- (3) Does the ACT Government have a date for when it wants the new green waste site to open; if so, what is that date.

# 753 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Minister for Housing and Suburban Development—

- (1) What is the current status of the development of a Build-to-Rent-to-Buy women's housing initiative in Ginninderry.
- (2) What potential sites in Ginninderry have been identified to date.
- (3) What funding models have been considered so far.
- (4) When is the pilot expected to commence.
- (5) How long will the pilot be in operation.
- (6) How many participants are expected.
- (7) How will participants be chosen for the pilot.
- (8) How can at-risk and vulnerable women in the ACT apply to participate in the pilot.
- (9) What eligibility criteria have been considered for this initiative, eg, age range, determinants for at-risk and vulnerability, income threshold, disability etc.
- (10) What other housing initiatives are available across the ACT for at-risk and vulnerable women.
- (11) Are there any Build-to-Rent-to-Buy schemes currently available in the ACT; if so, can the Minister provide details on these schemes.

- 754 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Minister for Housing and Suburban Development—
  - (1) On what date will the capping of the old Belconnen landfill commence.
  - (2) What is the estimated timeline for when the landfill capping will be completed.
  - (3) If the capping has already begun, when will it conclude.
  - (4) Is the uncapped landfill delaying the land release of nearby blocks; if so, why is it delaying the release.
  - (5) Has section 60 in Strathnairn been released for sale by the Government; if so, have all blocks been released; if not, why not, and when will they be released.
  - (6) Has section 57 in Strathnairn been released for sale by the Government; if so, have all blocks been released; if not, why not, and when will they be released.
  - (7) Did the Government inform developers working in the Ginninderry area that the landfill site capping would impact land release timeframes; if so, when were developers informed.
  - (8) What compensation are buyers entitled to, from the developer or the Government, for the delay in the land release in case the buyers suffer financial harm.
- 755 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Minister for Police and Emergency Services—In relation to the attempted escape of detainees at the Alexander Maconochie on 19 March 2022, were the drivers of the vehicle that approached the fence at the time of the attempted escape apprehended; if so, have they received a trial; if so, what was the result of the trial; if not, is ACT Policing still looking for them.
- 756 MRS KIKKERT: To ask the Minister for Corrections—
  - (1) In relation to the escape attempt of detainees at the Alexander Maconochie Centre (AMC) on 19 March 2022, were the officers who deployed capsicum spray qualified for the use of the spray.
  - (2) What penalties have been issued to the detainees for their escape attempt by the AMC.
  - (3) How did the detainees smash through the window.
- 757 **MS LEE**: To ask the Assistant Minister for Economic Development—
  - (1) Of the four Canberra Innovation Network (CBRIN) ICON grant recipients where CBRIN staff were also shareholders in those companies, can the Minister provide (a) the company name, (b) CBRIN staff member name, (c) value of the grant and (d) date of the grant.

- (2) Are CBRIN staff required to provide annual pecuniary declarations; if so, can the Minister provide copies of the most up-to-date declarations for all CBRIN staff.
- (3) Can the Minister provide a list of all current directorships held by CBRIN staff.
- (4) Does the Griffin Accelerator or KILN Incubator sub-let office space from CBRIN at 1 Moore Street Canberra; if so, can the Minister advise the annual rent paid since this arrangement began.
- (5) Are any CBRIN staff shareholders or employees of the Griffin Accelerator or KILN Incubator; if so, can the Minister specify those individuals' roles in these entities.
- (6) Have any of the recipients of ICON grants expended funds or paid for the services of the Griffin Accelerator or KILN Incubator.
- (7) For CBRIN as an entity and key CBRIN staff, can the Minister provide details of involvement in capital raising including funds raised, nature and level of involvement, and details of successful exits (if applicable) since 2012, and for CBRIN since its establishment: (a) Pre-Seed Rounds, (b) Seed Rounds, (c) Series A Rounds, (d) Series B Rounds, (e) Series C Rounds and (f) Initial Public Offerings.
- (8) Can the Minister provide detail on the nature of the involvement with CBRIN, including annual funding and number of staff provided of the (a) the Australian National University, (b) University of Canberra, (c) Canberra Institute of Technology and (d) Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation.
- 758 MR PARTON: To ask the Minister for Housing and Suburban Development—
  - (1) Is there an income threshold for new Housing ACT applicants; if so, what is this threshold.
  - (2) Is there a threshold for tenants already residing in Housing ACT properties; if so, (a) what is this threshold, (b) what options are there for people who exceed this threshold, (c) what happens if tenants exceed the income threshold and (d) how are the threshold rules enforced.
- 759 MR PARTON: To ask the Minister for Housing and Suburban Development—
  - (1) Does the Housing ACT Growth and Renewal Program have a discretion process.
  - (2) What is the process for tenants to apply for this discretion
  - (3) What is the process for reviewing the applications including the criteria for decisions.
  - (4) Who reviews applications.
  - (5) Who makes the approval or denial process of the applications.

- (6) How many have applied for this discretion from the over 300 who received notices.
- (7) How many have been (a) approved and (b) denied.
- (8) What were the reasons for denial of applications.
- 760 MS CASTLEY: To ask the Minister for Business and Better Regulation—
  - (1) Has the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) ever granted the ACT Government an Environmental Authorisation; if so, (a) since 2014, when were the authorisations granted, (b) what were they granted for, for example, what environmental policy was the ACT Government asking for an exemption and (c) did the EPA test the ACT Government's environmental authorisation activities; if so, has the ACT Government ever breached its environmental authorisation; if not; why not.
  - (2) If the Government has breached its environmental authorisation, (a) what was the environmental authorisation for and when was it granted by the EPA, (b) were any reports completed by EPA or the ACT Government on how/why it breached the environmental authorisation and (c) was the breach of the environmental authorisation made public at the time EPA became aware that ACT Government breached its environmental authorisation.
