DR PATERSON: In terms of the dangerous driving portal for people to input into that, has that been working well and—yes.

Mr Lee: Thanks, doctor. Certainly it has been effective in terms of people using the online reporting to report instances of dangerous driving but also just as importantly we have also established a mechanism there where they can upload their video and other material that is useful for police in terms of our response.

So certainly I will pass to Mr Whowell because we have got some specific data about the number of infringements that we have issued.

THE CHAIR: Again, perhaps we could take that on notice. We need to move on. To there is two things on notice.

Mr Mick Gentleman MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

On 8 May 2024 ACT Policing expanded its online reporting capability to include Dangerous Driving, providing the community with a new mechanism to report bad driver behaviour to police.

The first six weeks of this capability operating, saw 84 online Dangerous Driving reports received by ACT Policing. Of these reports:

- Ten were issued Traffic Infringement Notices.
- Six received a Caution or Warning; and
- 11 required further police investigation.
