MR WERNER-GIBBINGS: Thanks, Chair. This is the question, page 91, the design phase of the new Coroner's case management system. What is the consultation that took place through the design phase of that new system and who was it with?

Ms Cheyne: I think we might need to invite Mr Wickham back.

Mr Wickham: I am afraid I probably need to take that on notice just in terms of giving you a complete sort of list of the people that were consulted with. It happened a little bit before my arrival at the court so I would prefer to take that on notice. But I know that it has been through a very detailed design process and that there was consultation undertaken in connection with that. I am just not sure of its kind of extent, so I would prefer to give an accurate answer.

MR WERNER-GIBBINGS: Okay, who, and what were the questions asked and the answers received.

Mr Wickham: Sure.


MS TARA CHEYNE MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

The Coroners Case Management System has been through an initial scoping phase with private consultant Pragma, who consulted with ACT Policing and the Coroners Court, including Forensic Medicine Centre staff. Feedback from families and community members previously received by the Court were provided to Pragma to incorporate into the scope. This included the concept of a family portal which was suggested by a stakeholder during the Legge stakeholder consultation workshop day.

Digital CBR is currently undertaking the detailed design phase.
