Access Canberra received 14 complaints from 5 members of the public about noise from amplified music and gym equipment at the Harrison premises.

The complainants advised the noise from the music and weights being dropped occurred in the early mornings and on Saturday and Sunday. The complainants advised that this was impacting on their sleep and quiet use of their homes.
