## **Asked by Nicole Lawder:**

In relation to: Urban Management – Complaints

- 1) I refer to the 6585 complaints responded to by the directorate. How many of these complaints lead to action occurring?
- 2) Are all complaints lodged responded to?
- 3) Are you able to provide a breakdown of the complaints? I.e. how many were illegal dumping, dead trees, potholes so forth.

## Chris Steel MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

The 6585 complaints are the complaints received by Transport Canberra and City Services, Licensing and Compliance (L&C) through Fix My Street or via the Access Canberra call centre. L&C adopts a 'risk-of-harm' regulatory approach, targeting resources to where the risks of harm, unsafe practices or misconduct are the greatest, thereby strengthening its capacity to take action where the community and/or the environment are most at risk. In line with the 'Licensing and Compliance Accountability Statement', L&C prioritises its actions and decisions based on a range of considerations, including:

- conduct that causes or may cause harm or risk to people, public land, territory assets, or the environment;
- conduct that is systemic and is likely to have a detrimental effect on the community and/or the environment; and
- conduct that demonstrates a blatant disregard for the law.

At this point in time, providing data to address the three questions would require a manual assessment. Due to the size and nature of the request, the diversion of resources to undertake this work is not feasible.
