Hi Mark,

I heard you on the radio a few Friday's ago saying you were happy to receive emails about the infringements issued to drivers at the "new" 40 km on Northbourne /London Circuit location. We had previously signed your petition for a review of these fines.

We are a family owned local catering business and have been completely unable to trade in this latest lockdown and had yet to recover from the last one. Our business vehicle , registered in our business name received 4 fines, each \$1,299 . The fines were for infringements on the 5/8,10/8,12/8 and 14/8. Our driver has been using this regular access road for catering deliveries for the past 6 years and was clearly unaware of the changed conditions. By the time the notices of infringement were received in the mail the four offences had already occurred so there was no opportunity to advise the driver that traffic conditions had changed

The business is unable to pay the fines and if we identify the driver he will loose his licence and be unable to work. The driver is a director of the company and with staff shortages and not being able to pay for extra staff these fines place a heavy burden on our business recovery.
