Asked by Mr Mark Parton MLA: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services

In relation to: Bus Driver Staffing

- 1. In relation to ACT Budget 2021-22 PTCS QON No. 21 Answer 3. a. (copy attached), from 1 November 2021 to 28 February 2022 what were the:
 - a. Actual number of staff on the payroll in terms of full-time, part-time and casual (or other categories) of staff;
 - b. Numbers of staff in each category in a. above available for rostering for driver duties?
- 2. For each week from 12 August 2021 to 24 February 2022, how many drivers were on leave in the following categories:
 - a. Sick leave
 - b. Covid Leave
 - c. Annual Leave
 - d. Other Leave
- 3. What was the highest number of drivers on leave for any given reason on a single day from 12 August 2021 to 24 February 2022?
- Why is the 897 head count listed for bus operators as at 30 June 2021 in Table 15: Headcount by classification and gender as at 30 June 2021, p. 67 TCCS Annual Report 2020-21, different from the 930 listed as the total number of bus drivers in the ACT Budget 2021-22 PTCS QON No. 21 Answer 3. a. for June 2021?
 - a. What is the breakdown of this discrepancy in terms of casual, full time, and part time staff?

The table above reflects the total number of absences per leave type over the duration of the week, for example a driver who was on annual leave for five days is recorded as five absences.

- 3. This data is not readily available and requires manual calculation which would require the redeployment of staff from their regular operational duties. As such, we are unable to provide the highest daily figure of staff on leave during the period 12 August 2021 to 24 February 2022, however as demonstrated in response to question two, the highest number of absences recorded over a week was 1,355 in week commencing 17 January 2021.
- 4. The variable between the two headcount figures of 897 and 930 can be attributed to the data being collated from two different sources. The 897 is derived from a pay system which only includes employees who were paid during the pay period of 30 June 2021, whereas the 930 is the headcount of registered drivers within our rostering system.
 - a. The 930 provides the total registered drivers within our rostering system which includes those who may be on leave without pay or casual employees who did not undertake work in the previous fortnight. The breakdown of discrepancies

(difference of 33 drivers) is not readily available and would require manual review of both data sets. Due to the restricted timeframe available to respond to this QON, we are unable to provide the breakdown of the 33 drivers.
