ANSWER TO QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE DURING PUBLIC HEARINGS

Asked by MR DAVIS on 23 August 2022: MR JIM CORRIGAN took on notice the following question(s):

In relation to:

Mr Corrigan: I have read and acknowledge the privilege statement. Mr Davis, with all of the assets that TCCS manage across the territory, we have asset management plans for them. With those facilities that you mentioned—where we hit tennis balls against the wall, and those sorts of things—obviously, we know about those assets and we manage them as necessary. I can take it on notice if you want some details about how many of those extra facilities we manage besides all of the ovals and sportsgrounds. We can do that and provide that to you. TCCS manage all of that, unless they are on private land or something like that.

MR DAVIS: I would appreciate it if you could take that on notice. Could you also let me know how regularly they are checked by inspectors for their condition?

YVETTE BERRY MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: –

Transport Canberra and City Services maintain two tennis courts in Tharwa and Narrabundah. They also have responsibility for 43 modified basketball courts, many of which are co-located with playgrounds. If they are co-located, they are informally inspected in line with the playground inspection routine. Alternatively, when a park is litter picked, they are informally inspected.
