Minister Berry: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: -

 The Health Justice Partnerships have supported over 1000 clients from 1 January 2019 to 30 June 2022. The ACT Government arranged training on the ACT Domestic and Family Violence Risk Assessment and Management Framework to specialist domestic and family violence sector organisations in May and June 2022. Further training is currently being undertaken and explored, including for more mainstream services.

a-b. The Framework has been distributed to specialist domestic and family violence services, mainstream services and relevant ACT Government areas and ACT Government is currently developing an implementation plan for the promotion and embedding of the Framework.
