1444 MS CASTLEY: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services —

- (1) How many trees have been planted in each suburb in Yerrabi.
- (2) Is the planting project for Yerrabi complete.
- (3) Is there a new tree maintenance plan to check on the growth and health of the trees recently planted.
- (4) Is there a plan to water the new trees during the hot summer months.

1445 MR CAIN: To ask the Minister for Business and Better Regulation —

- (1) What are the details of the governing regulation that determines (a) when drones are allowed to be used during the day, (b) when drones are allowed to be used during the night, (c) who is eligible for a drone licence and what the requirements are for acquiring permission to fly a drone, (d) whether it is legal to fly drones through suburban, RZ1 neighbourhoods, and if it is legal, what is the licence that permits this activity and (e) whether it is legal to fly drones around district, town or group centres, and if it is legal, what is the licence that permits this activity.
- (2) Are there separate categories of licensing that allow for more privileges when operating a drone than others, i.e., can some users fly a drone under more liberal conditions than others; if so, what are the details of the governing regulation.

- (3) Are drones restricted from being operated in certain zones in the ACT; if so, what are the details of the governing regulation.
- (4) Are there height limits to flying a drone; if so, what are the details of the governing regulation.

- (1) In relation to trees planted close to the fence line for those living in Nicholls who back onto the golf course, can the Minister advise, if a grant has been given for tree planting, what are the guidelines for the planting process for (a) type of trees, (b) density, (c) maintenance and (d) communication strategy.
- (2) What species of trees can be planted near (a) water mains and (b) sewage lines.
- (3) Is there a planting guide for eucalyptus trees in particular, and how (a) close they can be planted to homes and (b) densely they can be planted in a suburban area.

- MS CASTLEY: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services Can the Minister advise what traffic calming measures will be implemented in Nicholls, following safety concerns raised by constituents, at (a) Curran Drive between the roundabout at the golf course and the roundabout at Curran and Temperley Street, (b) Curran Drive between the roundabout at Temperely Street and McClelland Avenue and (c) Temperley Street between the Dobbin Circuit roundabout and Steadman place.

1449 MR MILLIGAN: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services —

- (1) Was an additional crew funded to support mowing efforts in the 2022-23 budget year; if so, will this crew funding continue.
- (2) If the crew funding is to continue, for how long will it continue, and why is this additional crew needed.

- 1451 MR MILLIGAN: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services —
 In this current season, how many mowers and Transport Canberra and City Services staff are available to mow in the (a) Belconnen, (b) Tuggeranong, (c) Gungahlin, (d) Inner North, (e) Inner South and (f) Woden/ Weston Creek regions.
- 1452 MR CAIN: To ask the Minister for Sustainable Building and Construction
 - (1) What, if at all, is the noise decibel level threshold for residential buildings to be considered defective.
 - (2) Are structural noise issues in buildings considered in the building certifier's assessment.
 - (3) Do governing regulations exist for structural noise issues in buildings; if so, can the Minister provide the relevant details.
 - (4) How many legal cases in the ACT have been brought by owners' corporations or unit-owners against builders, developers or certifiers related to structural noise issues in the past, including cases that went to the (a) Supreme Court and (b) ACT Civil and Administrative Tribunal.

 - (3) What is the current population of rabbits in each suburb in Yerrabi.

 - (5) Can an assessment be undertaken of the population of rabbits in Nicholls, particularly near Sue Geh Circuit and the area surrounding Temperley Street and the Stedman place playground.
