MISS NUTTALL: Thank you. I would like to just quickly head back to the asset management plans. I am interested, would you be able to provide a breakdown for each territory pool showing how much was spent over the last financial years at each pool, and how much of that was spent by the territory as opposed to the operator?

Ms Berry: Yes, that is probably some detail we do not have available today, and take on notice on what is possible to provide. I am not sure about what—if Belgravia would have that information at hand on what they do as well, but you know, we can ask them.

Yvette Berry MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

For the 2024-25 financial year, \$3,626,548.00 was spent across the Territory aquatic portfolio by the Territory Government. A breakdown of this figure per site is detailed below:

These figures only relate to actual spends made via Controlled Recurring Payments and Capital Investment funding provisions. This breakdown does not include pool subsidy payments.

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For the 2024-25 financial year, a total of \$4,514,062.00 was spent by operators across the Territory aquatic portfolio. A breakdown of this figure per site is detailed below:
