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**MS CARRICK:** Okay. Thank you. With the data, do you have data at the district level for example, the wellbeing framework and for, you know, just any initiative or outpour or program that you deliver?

**Mr Campbell:** I would not be able to talk to the wellbeing data. We might have to take that on notice for you to see—I suspect if it is relating to basic economic data, some of it will be captured through ABS data, which goes to a final level of detail. In terms of actual implementation of initiatives though, most of the data would not be captured that way, so I would say no.

**MS CARRICK:** So can you take on notice the data sources that you use for the Wellbeing Framework?

**Mr Campbell:** I can take that on notice. It is another part of CMTEDD that I am—yes, we will take that on notice, yes.

**MS CARRICK:** Okay. Thank you.

**Ms Stephen-Smith:** Just to say in terms of the data sources for the Wellbeing Framework, if you look at the Wellbeing Framework website, all of the indicators do point to their data source, so that can be provided on notice, but it is available on the Wellbeing Framework website.

**MS CARRICK:** Okay. Does the data source that you are using, does it go down to district level, like, is it at the ACT level, state level, sort of, or do we have lower level, district level data?

**Mr Campbell:** Generally speaking, if it is attached to a piece of data collected by the ABS, it usually have finer graduations down to potentially SA2 or SA3 level, which is sort of suburb or district level. for a lot of the other initiatives the data would not have been originally collected in that form so it would be impossible to expose—impose it but yes, as I say, we can come back and make those links available to you.

**MS CARRICK:** Okay. Thank you.

ANDREW BARR MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

The data sources that are used to report on progress against the indicators for each domain in the ACT Wellbeing Framework are included as part of the wellbeing data dashboard, which is available at this link – <https://www.act.gov.au/wellbeing/explore-overall-wellbeing>.

In broad terms, the key data sources are from the University of Canberra *Living Well in the ACT Region* survey, ABS data surveys and releases, ACT Government administrative data and a range of national reports and surveys.

The University of Canberra released its latest *Living Well in the ACT Region* report in October 2025 and it is available at this link – <https://www.regionalwellbeing.org.au/living-well-in-the-act-region/>. The University of Canberra's wellbeing survey is a significant input to the wellbeing dashboard and does provide data at district level.

The specific data source used for each measure is listed on the page for each measure description – for example, the personal wellbeing data source is available at this link - <https://www.act.gov.au/wellbeing/explore-overall-wellbeing/personal-wellbeing>

The ACT wellbeing data dashboard reports on data at the ACT level. Its purpose is to report every two years, at a jurisdiction level, on a set of high-level measures reflective of the Domains and Indicators in the Framework. The wellbeing data dashboard, including the data that is sourced from the University of Canberra, will be updated during 2025-26. This is not to exclude other data being used in considering wellbeing issues.
