I refer to your email request to me under the *Freedom of Information Act 1989* (the Act) dated 31 March 2014 for all documents relating to a proposed study trip to investigate overseas prostitution laws by Assembly members and anyone proposed to accompany them, including all documents relating to the original travel proposal as well as the final proposal and any other documents on the subjects.

I am authorised under section 22 of the Act to make decisions on access to documents held by OLA and liability for charges.

After conducting a thorough search of all relevant records held by OLA, documents were identified that fall within the ambit of your request. A schedule of those documents is attached, together with copies of those documents.

Your right of review

Internal review

You are entitled under s 59(1) of the Act to request a review of my decision. This right of review extends to a review of the adequacy of the search for documents undertaken by OLA. You have 28 days after receiving notice of my decision to ask for a review, or a further period, as allowed by the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly. Your request should be addressed to:


