1. Of the previous work already completed, how much remains in scope and relevant?

ANDREW BARR: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:–

1. All remains relevant, and no scope remains specifically excluded, although elements may not be a current priority (for instance, unless there is a Federal Government contribution as in the case of Australia Forum). This work includes:
  - (a) West Basin foreshore design for Stage 1 and Henry Rolland Park.  
West Basin foreshore conceptual design for Stage 2.  
West Basin foreshore conceptual design for the promenade.  
Australia Forum reference design.  
Parkes Way re-design feasibility and early concept development (now being further progressed by Transport Canberra and City Services).  
City to the Lake master plan.  
Due diligence for first land releases.
