Ms Le Couteur MLA: To ask the Minister for City Services

Transport Canberra and City Services Directorate, 2018–19 Annual Report, output class 2.1 Roads and Infrastructure.

In relation to IRAP/ANRAM

What is the current progress on accepting the IRAP and ANRAM road safety analysis carried out on ACT roads, and implementing safety improvements for cycling, especially on Uriarra loop?

Mr Chris Steel MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:—

The IRAP/ANRAM assessment has been completed. Data for approximately 980km of the ACT's arterial road network, collected in June 2018, was used to create the IRAP.

This rating formed the baseline level of risk that could be used in the future to assist development of the road infrastructure design changes to the network.

The IRAP/ANRAM rating scores are a broad measure of the individual vehicle occupant risk to sustaining a severe injury. Cyclists are not assessed individually as a specific road user and therefore comment in relation to cyclists using the Uriarra loop cannot be provided.
