Inquiry into ACT Budget 2021–22 ANSWER TO QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE 27 October 2021

Asked by Jo Clay MLA on 27 October 2021: Mick Gentleman MLA took on notice the following question(s):

In relation to:

MS CLAY: I do, thank you, Chair. I was hoping, minister, for an update on our needle exchange program.

Mr Gentleman: Thanks very much for the question. I might just pass straight to the Commissioner for that detail.

Mr Johnson: Thank you, minister. I understand the needle exchange program was something that was contemplated some time ago but ultimately was voted against by staff. And so, as I understand it, that program has not progressed for—I might be corrected by people who have been around longer than me, but I think even as far back as 2010 or 2011, as I understand it.

MS CLAY: Can I get some more detail about that? I thought it was—was it government policy? I thought it was formed government policy.

Mr Gentleman: We will take that on notice, Ms Clay. It may have been for a previous government but, yes, we will take that on notice and come back to you.

MS CLAY: Okay, thank you. So I guess if it has been abandoned then I guess we need to know an update that that is no longer government policy, and perhaps the reasons why would be helpful. Thank you.

Mick Gentleman MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

Any process for development, consideration and implementation of a needle syringe program (NSP) requires appropriate consultation, in particular with staff and unions. In 2016 a proposed model was overwhelmingly rejected by eligible staff through ballot.

There has been no further progress of NSP policy since the unsuccessful ballot. A deed of agreement with the CPSU, signed by the previous Minister for Corrections remains in place. The deed of agreement provides that the implementation of any proposed model is subject to majority support by staff.
