Elizabeth Kikkert MLA: To ask the Minister for Education and Youth Affairs

Ref: Youth Affairs, CSD Annual Report 2020–21, pp. 51

In relation to: Youth Week 2022

- 1. In the hearing, the Minister stated Youth Week events this year will target young people 'on the fringe', with one strategy making events free. Will all Youth Week events this year be free for young people?
- 2. Can the Minister please provide a list of planned Youth Week events and activities (such as free admission to the zoo), including dates, times, and locations?
- 3. What strategies are being used to advertise Youth Week and these events to those 'on the fringe'?

MINISTER BERRY- The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

1. As indicated within the hearing, part of 2022 Youth Week celebrations, free events will be provided for young people, focusing particularly on supporting young people who may experience some barriers to participation in Youth Week activities. This includes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people, LGBTIQA+ young people, young carers and young people who are in out-of-home care, as well as young people from refugee backgrounds.

However, while not all 2022 Youth Week events are free for all participants, the Community Services Directorate (CSD) has partnered with entertainment and recreational businesses across the Territory to deliver interesting and engaging free events for young people.

2. The ACT Government is finalising event details with Youth Week Grant recipients and a complete list of 2022 Youth Week activities will be available on the CSD website in the lead up to 2022 Youth Week.

At this time, the below free ACT Government events and activities have been scheduled for 2022 Youth Week:

- Ice skating at Phillip Swimming and Ice Skating Centre, Thursday 14 April at 1:30pm
