MS LAWDER: Okay. And there was a letterbox drop in the area which, I think, was very well received. Some many residents said to me it was the first time they have had, or that they could remember, having a letterbox drop.

Ms Cheyne: Yes.

MS LAWDER: How many households did you drop letters to?

Ms Cheyne: I think, Ms Lawder, that might actually fall within Minister Steel's responsibility because ultimately, while EPA was aware of the activity and obviously receives and records the complaints, the EPA did work closely with the team that is ultimately responsible for the tip and spoke with them about proactively communicating. But I think the responsibility itself sat with Minister Steel.

But if you would like, I think we can take that on notice and at least endeavour to find out.

Tara Cheyne MLA, Minister for Business and Better Regulation: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: –


