Road work signage is at times left up even though the works are completed. This can lead to confusion where signage is not reflective of the road conditions and comes with risks of crashes. What are the guidelines around road work signage installation and de-installation? What are the mechanisms the ACT Government uses to monitor and enforce compliance of road works signage to ensure they are reflective of road conditions and not left up beyond works completion?

Ms Tara Cheyne MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

Roads ACT authorises contractors to implement Temporary Traffic Management (TTM) across the road network. It is the contractor's responsibility to design, implement and remove the TTM controls as part of their work.

Roads ACT takes a risk-based approach to compliance and undertakes random checks regarding TTMs.

Roads ACT also responds to reports from the community regarding TTMs via Access Canberra (13 22 81) or Fix My Street reports. Upon receipt of an issue, an officer from Roads ACT will investigate and seek to resolve the issue, notifying and engaging directly with the contractor where possible.

TTMs are important for public safety in and around road works, both for road users and workers. Changes to road conditions also increases risks for road users that TTMs seek to reduce and minimise.
