I wish to protest against the prostitution that is happening in the ACT. Because the ACT is known as a bureaucracy area of Australia and the character of that city where I went only recently is of a certain type, with a predominance of well off Government workers, it seems people are becoming entrapped into immoral lifestyles there. I support a full inquiry by government in this problem.

I believe with many other that the Swedish model is better for Australia and the ACT so that prostitution is made illegal and this reduces the number of prostitutes and there is less danger to young women drawn illegally into this trade and death like the Cameron girl of 2008.
