Honorable members of committie,

I would like to voice my concerns and objections to any change into third party insurance schemes. I do strongly feel that anyone injured in an accident has the right to fair and equitable compensation. If changes to the laws are going to include provision for residential accomadation, medical and carers for life, for victim who suffer brain injury and partial or full parralises as a minimum standard that is a good thing, but nothing can replace quality of life for these victims and they should still have the human right to be compensated for there loss.
