ANSWER TO QUESTION ON NOTICE

Asked by Peter Cain MLA:

Ref: JACSD Annual Report 2019-20, Human Rights Commission, 'Protecting Vulnerable People '

In relation to: COVID-19 Emergency Response Legislation Amendment Act 2020

- 1. As part of the ACT Government's COVID-19 Response, the function of the HRC was to deal with complaints about abuse, neglect or exploitation were expanded. During the 2019-20 financial year, how many complaints about abuse, neglect or exploitation of vulnerable people were made?
  - a. How many of those were resolved during the 2019-20 financial year?
  - b. How many complaints from the reporting period remained open at the end of the 2019-20 financial year?
  - c. How many total complaints remain open currently?
  - d. How many of complaints made during the 2019-20 financial year occurred after the passage of the COVID-19 Emergency Response Legislation Amendment Act 2020?

Tara Cheyne MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

The vulnerable person complaint jurisdiction commenced on 14 May 2020. The jurisdiction is not retrospective.

In the 2019/20 financial year the Commission received the Commission received 2 vulnerable people complaints.

- a. Neither of those two complaints was resolved in the 2019/20 financial year.
- b. Two complaints from the 2019/20 reporting period remained open at the end of the reporting period
- c. As at 1 March 2021 the Commission had 8 open vulnerable person complaints
- d. Two vulnerable person complaints occurred after the passage of the COVID-19 Emergency Response Legislation Amendment Act 2020 in the 2019/20 reporting period
