I have been a resident of Giralang since 2013. During this time the 'shops' have transitioned from derelict buildings, through a demolition site, to the eyesore that it currently is today.

The current half built/half derelict site, right next to a primary school, is an accident waiting to happen. The security around the site is inadequate, especially over such a long period of time. The developers started to make progress, and then suddenly halted. It is time that action is taken to move forward.
