## **ANSWER TO QUESTION ON NOTICE**

Ed Cocks MLA: To ask the Minister for Business and Better Regulation

Ref: Better digital services - Increasing Access Canberra staff, Budget Outlook, p.115

In relation to: Access Canberra Staffing

- 1. How many staff will be hired under this budget initiative?
  - a. What is the net effect of this recruitment once attrition is taken into consideration?
  - b. What service line(s) within Access Canberra will these staff be deployed?
    - i. How many will be employed within each of the services lines?
- 2. There is a partial offset by higher revenue from increases in registration and regulatory fees from 1 September 2022:
  - a. What is the average percentage increase of all of these fees?
  - b. What is the highest percentage increase of all of these fees?
  - c. Does any of this increased revenue include revenue from either traffic or other fines?
    - i. If so, how much?

Minister Tara Cheyne MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: —

- 1. 16 FTE have been allocated in 2022-23 under this budget initiative.
  - a. Net increase of 16 FTE in 2022-23.
  - b. The 16 FTE will be deployed to the Working with Vulnerable People Unit and Access Canberra Service Centres.
    - 11 FTE will be deployed to the Working with Vulnerable People Unit for 2022-23 only. 5 FTE will be deployed to Access Canberra Service Centres ongoing.
- 2. The indexation of the vehicle registration and regulatory fees relates to offsetting the cost of increased postage and numberplate production and is not related to the additional staff.
  - a. From 1 September 2022 there was a 0.26% indexation to the fee for vehicle registrations and 0.29% indexation on regulatory fees.
  - b. 0.29%.
  - c. No.
