## Inquiry into Annual and Financial Reports 2021-2022 ANSWER TO QUESTION ON NOTICE

## Asked by Elizabeth Kikkert MLA:

Reference: Hearing on 01 November 2022, Annual Report of Justice and Community Safety 2021-2022, page 81

In relation to: CORIS

- 1. How many ACTCS employees have been trained to use CORIS so far since it's deployment in June?
- a. How many people still need to be trained and is there a timeline for when everyone who needs to trained will be trained?
- 2. What does this training involve?
- 3. What data is CORIS currently capturing as part of business-as-usual activities?

Mick Gentleman MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

- 1. As of 9 November 2022, 361 ACT Corrective Services (ACTCS) employees have been trained in CORIS Basics training.
  - a. All ACTCS staff who required CORIS Basics training have been trained. All core users of CORIS in Custodial Operations have been provided in-depth business process training. There are a further 15 custodial Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) who will be trained on 7 December 2022. Any staff requests for additional training are being catered to by SMEs. Training is ongoing via on-the-job training and through access to SMEs as such, there is no timeline for training completion.
- 2. CORIS training involves a mix of scheduled classroom training which looks at CORIS Basic, self-taught learning and in-depth on-the-job training conducted by SMEs. CORIS Basics training is for all staff who need access to CORIS and includes basic operations processes. Self-taught learning materials are available to staff via the ACTCS intranet.
