ANSWER TO QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE DURING PUBLIC HEARINGS

Asked by Mark Parton MLA on 24 July 2023: Andrew Barr MLA took on notice the following question(s):

In relation to:

THE CHAIR: Just in closing from me, you have indicated that the mobile phone cameras are one aspect of this, but I just want to know additionally why you are so confident that you are going to raise an additional \$50 million over two financial years. Are we going to see more speed camera zones like the one on Northbourne Avenue which has famously captured thousands of motorists? Is that going to be the approach of your government in revenue raising?

Mr Barr: Well, I will endeavour to provide you with some further information in relation to the different categories that lead to that ultimate aggregated number. This may come across many areas of government. I do not sit there and decide, "It will be this number," it is the subject of multiple agencies who are responsible either for the enforcement or collection of fines.

But to the extent I can provide you with some further information, having contacted those different areas, I am happy to do so. So I take that element on notice.

Andrew Barr MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: –

The forecast amount of total fines for 2024-25 to 2026-27 reflects the levels of public safety compliance activity, including road safety compliance, in each of those years.
