Inquiry into Annual and Financial Reports 2022-2023 ANSWER TO QUESTION ON NOTICE

Reference: Hearing on 20 November 2023, Annual Report of Transport Canberra and City Services 2022-2023

In relation to: Transport Canberra and City Services Directorate and Whole of ACT Transport Emissions

The TCCS annual report 2022-23 has accountability indicators for transport for:

- customer satisfaction with light rail, access to and maintenance of cycle and walking paths, bus operations and the road network
- the percentage of buses that meet standards under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and bridges that meet standards under SM 1600
- the increase in the length of our paths and cycle lanes; and
- three measures for road resurfacing.

However, there are no accountability indicators relating to greenhouse gas emissions from transport.

How is TCCS measuring and reducing transport emissions, without setting any KPIs to do so?

Minister Chris Steel: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: -

In addition to the above Accountability Indicators, Transport Canberra also reports on the 'percentage of in-service fleet Euro 5 or better'.

The Zero Emission Transition Plan for Transport Canberra sets out zero emissions targets in line with the ACT Climate Change Strategy. Transport Canberra and City Services also report on the Sustainable Development Performance which monitors electricity and fuel use as found in table 25, page 108 of the TCCS Annual report for 2022/23.
