### **Inquiry into Annual and Financial Reports 2022-2023** **ANSWER TO QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE**

Asked by Mr Peter Cain MLA on 23 November 2023: Ms Gillian Geraghty took on notice the following question(s):

In relation to: Major Projects Canberra staff survey update

**MR CAIN:** So the staff survey regarding witnessing corruption, where the question was, how many MPC staff have witnessed corruption? My understanding is the figure of 29 August last year was four per cent. Are you able to provide an updated figure for that?

**Ms Geraghty:** Sorry, could you repeat the question?

**MR CAIN:** So there was a staff MPC employee survey about how many MPC staff have witnessed corruption. The figure as at 29 August last year was four per cent. Do you have an update on that figure?

**Ms Geraghty:** No, I do not. I would have to take that question on notice.

**Mr Andrew Barr MLA:** The answer to the Member's question is as follows:—

By way of update, in the March 2023 ACT Government Employee Survey 67 per cent of Major Projects Canberra staff participated, with seven per cent of respondents indicating they had witnessed corruption. However, no employees have reported that they have witnessed corruption to the Human Resources team or Senior Executive Responsible for Business Integrity Risk (SERBIR) for any formal reviews to be completed.

As a follow on, an all staff email has been sent reminding staff of MPC's Integrity, Fraud and Corruption policies and processes and their obligations to report all incidences.
