(1) In your response to QON 1663, the electronic monitoring feasibility study was slated for completion by the end of 2024, why has the physical completion date for this project been revised to June 2025 as per page 38, 2024-25 ACT Budget Statement D.

(2) What was the primary cause of the delay in physical completion date.

(3) Has a draft version of the electronic monitoring feasibility study been published internally yet.


Shane Rattenbury MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

- (1) As stated in QON 1663, the 2023-24 Budget provided \$377,000 over 2 years for an Electronic Monitoring Feasibility Study, which will be completed towards the end of 2024. The funding provided for external consultants to support the feasibility study, which will be completed as stated by the end of 2024. The funding also provides for an Information and Security Assessment and a JACS ICT Project Officer to support this work and ICT consideration, which will be finalised by June 2025.

- (2) There have been no delays to the completion of the feasibility study.
- (3) The feasibility study is being completed in stages. Final advice on the options analysis and resourcing have not yet been provided to Government.
