Dear Members

The ACT Integrity Commission has brought to my attention that there are small but significant typographical errors in paragraph 69 of its Investigation Report for Operation Falcon, a copy of which I provided to you last week in accordance with the *Integrity Commission Act 2018*. The paragraph currently reads

69. Only complaints which disclose critical incidents are reportable to the ACT Corrective Services Inspector (**Inspector**). Upon receipt of such a complaint, the Inspector would “deem whether or not they are going to investigate that”. It is apparent that Person 1’s complaint was reported to the Inspector but missed medical observations do not fall within a ‘Notifiable Incident Category’ as set out at Annex A of the Incident Reporting Policy.

The proposed replacement paragraph should read

69. Only matters which disclose critical incidents are reportable to the ACT Office of the Inspector of Custodial Services (**Inspector**). Upon receipt of such a matter, the Inspector would “deem whether or not they are going to investigate that”. It is apparent that Person 1’s complaint was not reported to the Inspector but missed medical observations do not fall within a ‘Notifiable Incident Category’ as set out at Annex A of the Incident Reporting Policy.
