THE CHAIR: Good on you. I wonder if you might take on notice the average length of time to fix reported defects and the longest length of time. Is that information you could take on notice and bring back to us?

Mr Rampton: Yes. I can take that on notice.

Ms Tara Cheyne MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

The answer to the average length of time to repair a reported defect is contained in QON 130.

The longest timeframe for repair was for a work order raised on 30/07/2020. It was completed on 19/04/2024. This was a low priority work order (cosmetic issue - minor path cracking) that did not pose a safety issue.
