Chris Steel MLA, Minister for Transport took on notice the following question:

ACT Government contracts must comply with all laws - can you confirm whether that's a part of this contract and if so, at what point in time Government usually considers the contract should comply with all laws? (in addition to QTON 28)

THE CHAIR: Mr McHugh, I might ask you to take on notice—you are coming back on notice with some disability compliance information. I believe the ACT government contracts usually have a must comply with all laws. When you come back on notice, can you confirm whether that is part of this contract and if so, at what point in time government usually considers that contractors should comply with all laws. Just bring that back on notice just as a separate line.

Mr McHugh: The contract that you have got a copy of should be in there, but we will identify it, highlight it for you.

THE CHAIR: Yes. And at what point in time you would consider that that would kick in. We have a supplementary from Ms Tough.

Chris Steel MLA, Minister for Transport: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

As responded to part 1 of QTON 28 from this hearing (1 July 2025), the Contract for the Next Generation Ticketing System for Transport Canberra is very clear in terms of legislative compliance and policy conformance expectations.

The Government considers the contract should be complied with at all times and have received assurance from NEC Australia as to that compliance, as provided in the response to QTON 28.
