She expressed concerns for P01 and stated that another child must be hurting him.</p> <p>On the 9th of April P01's mother arrived in the afternoon to collect him. She approached P01 responsible person at the time, regarding two scratches on P01's face—one on his right cheek and one on his left. P01 had no prior knowledge of the injuries and noted that both scratches appeared old with scabbing present. No incident had been reported to her, and she communicated this to the mother.</p> <p>P01 also spoke with P01, another educator in P01's room. P01 explained that she had not witnessed how the scratches occurred. However, she mentioned that P01 had recently been exploring the outdoor bush area, which could have potentially caused the scratches. P01 did not express any discomfort or indicate that he was hurt. Between April 8th and 10th—P01's regular attendance days—I saw his father each morning. He greeted us warmly and appeared relaxed; he did not raise any concerns or mention the scratches.</p> <p>After being informed by P01 - P01's educator that P01 was upset</p>

over the phone in regards to P01's scratch, I called her to follow up. During our conversation, she seemed upset and defensive. She stated that P01 regularly comes home with scratches and bruises and that she had previously raised these concerns without seeing resolution. P01 expressed frustration, claiming the service was not taking her concerns seriously, and accused staff of inadequate supervision and neglect. She described the situation as "illegal" and insisted we were failing in our duty of care.

I explained our staffing ratios and outlined our supervision practices, reassuring her that our educators are attentive and maintain appropriate adequate supervision at all times. However, P01 was unconvinced and reiterated that if proper supervision were in place, P01 would not be coming home with injuries.

Throughout the conversation, I attempted to clarify that the scratch on P01's nose had not been witnessed, and that he had not reported any incidents earlier in the day. I also informed her that P01 often explores outdoor bush areas during play, which may account for some of the minor scratches observed. Despite this, P01 maintained that because her son claimed another child had hurt him, she believed the injury was caused by that child.

Since speaking with P01 and hearing her complaints about the service we agreed to organise a formal meeting with myself and my executive manager next Tuesday 22nd at 8am to try to resolve this issue. In the meantime educators have read and signed our supervision policy and procedure and have continued to maintain adequate supervision.

P01 has since sent this email after we scheduled our meeting. This email was sent on the 16th of April-

Hi P01,

I am writing this email in preparation for our meeting next week and to discuss with you and P01 our concerns.

As our son, P01, has been coming home with scratches and injuries on his face, nose, and cheeks for the last couple of weeks, we as parents now feel we need to sit down with the BRECC team to devise a way to prevent it. P01 has told us about these incidents and shared with us that another child from the centre is hurting him.

I have spoken to the educators from the Rivergum room and we have to admit we are struggling. The educators seem unaware and unwitnessed of the situations leading to these injuries. Hence, we are mostly concerned as adequate supervision must be in place at all times during a child's attendance. The incident report that was conducted yesterday after P01's injury states it was unwitnessed. This has been the case for the last 2 weeks when I spoke to educators, they seem unaware of the incidents occurring. That's why we need to take the matter seriously so that this does not reoccur.

Thank you for listening to our concerns P01.
