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Dear Sir/Madam,

This is p01 p01 p01, I am currently employed with Camp Australia as the service leader of St Jude's Primary School OSHC Service. I am writing to you to report unethical business practices conducted by the company. As the mandatory reporter, I have to make this report even though it is against my current employer.

I totally understand that Camp Australia is not a non-for-profit organization, however, its business practices for profit maximization have gone too far. In term 4 last year, none of the NSW and ACT Camp Australia OSHC services received their MTA budget, and we were told that in term 1 2025, we will receive a combined budget of term 4 2024 and term 1 2025 for MTA, however, we did not receive the combined budget in term 1 2025 instead a reduced budget. We have been coping with term 4 with limited resources to provide children with quality service, hoping to have sufficient budget in Term 1 2025, the company has failed to provide us with the promised budget and give us a reduced one. It has negated the attended children's right to have an appropriate level of resource to play and learn.

And recently, the company has decided to reduce Services' weekly grocery budget, take my service for example, for years, we had \$314 weekly budget for Woolworth to

cater our 400 weekly bookings (including both BSC and ASC bookings), we were struggling with the budget as the cost of living increased dramatically in recent years, last year July I have sent request for budget increase, however, the company has ignored my request as well as the General Manager's request. Last week, the company cut the budget from \$314 to \$250, the reason for the budget cut was the reduced number of bookings, however, our service still has 370 bookings each week, which means each booking only received \$0.68 per week. As for other Camp Australia ACT OSHC Services, their grocery budgets have been cut too, St Bede's from \$250 to \$200, Arawang from \$480 to \$275, Calwell from \$171 to \$155. The company clearly ignored the attended children's right to have a sufficient amount of food.

I hope my email will bring your attention to oversee Camp Australia's business practices, as I always believe that ACT as the national capital with the best standard of educational system should ensure our children receive the best quality of Learning experience and sufficient amount of food in Schools and OSHC Services.
