MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS

No. 54

TUESDAY, 16 MARCH 2010

The Assembly met at 10 a.m., pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (Mr Rattenbury) took the Chair and made a formal recognition that the Assembly was meeting on the lands of the traditional custodians. The Speaker asked Members to stand in silence and pray or reflect on their responsibilities to the people of the Australian Capital Territory.

Ms Bresnan moved—That leave of absence be granted to Ms Hunter for this sitting due to ill health.

4 ATTORNEY-GENERAL—PROPOSED CENSURE

Mr Seselja (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, moved—That this Assembly censures the Attorney-General for persistently and wilfully misleading the Assembly in relation to the Home Insulation Scheme by denying:

- (1) the existence of any documents relating to the scheme only to subsequently release hundreds of documents upon being forced to through a motion in the Assembly;
- (2) that the ACT Government had received complaints about "dodgy" installation of insulation; and

(3) that the ACT Government had received complaints about poor installation of insulation.
