

PROPOSAL FOR NON-EXECUTIVE MEMBER TO UNDERTAKE "STUDY TRAVEL"

I will be attending a number of meetings with the AEIOU Foundation, the Premier of Queensland, Ministers and Department officials and associated meetings in Brisbane on 12, 13 and 14 December. The meetings will be to discuss policies, learn about current projects, exchange information and examine future opportunities.

The meetings will take place on Wednesday 12 December, Thursday the 13th of December and Friday the 14th of December and the majority of the meetings will be held in Brisbane's CBD.

I understand that, if the proposal is approved, I will submit to you, within eight weeks of completing the activity, a written report detailing the travel undertaken and expenses incurred (including any reimbursement received for nominee accompanied travel), names and area of responsibility of persons contacted, a summary of business undertaken, and, in relation to any approved training undertaken, a report on that training.
