In relation to:

- 1. Why is the Education Directorate preventing outdoor education organisations from working with ACT public schools despite the low Covid-exposure risk?
- 2. Why can students in private schools and before and after school programs access these programs but public school students are prohibited?
- 3. Why haven't you responded to outdoor education advocacy groups that have contacted your office repeatedly about this issue?
- 4. When will you allow ACT public schools to access outdoor education programs like their NSW counterparts?

MS BERRY MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

- Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the ACT Education Directorate has responded by
 following the Health Guidelines for Schools and Early Childhood Education and Care
 (including OSHC) that are in place at any given time. These guidelines have been applied to
 all ACT public schools and have stipulated a requirement for students to stay within class or
 year groups (cohorting).
 - In ACT public schools, external providers were not considered to be part of a cohort. From Week 7 Term 1 2022, outdoor education programs re-commenced for ACT public schools. The Education Directorate has made this decision in consultation with ACT Health. However, these programs may only proceed if the location is less than a four-hour drive from the ACT and is of a maximum duration of two nights.

- 3. The ACT Government and the Education Directorate have been engaging regularly with outdoor education advocacy groups.
