Question:

MS ORR: Can I just get a quick overview from each of you as to what requirements and obligations you have under your current funding arrangement? Because Ms Mance, I think you made reference you had to attend six forums a year, so those sorts of things. So, what it is you are currently funded to do now?

Ms Mance: I think we are funded for, I guess, a moderate amount of activities that we have to do under our contract. But I guess it is a case of like what impact do you want the environmental organisations to have? Because if we reduced our services back to the minimum then the organisation would be a shell. And what we would be providing to government would be well under what we need in the current climate crisis and what we are being asked to do in terms of bringing expertise and the voice of community to government.

So that minimum standard does not kind of really—

MS ORR: Yes, that is not really—sorry, Ms Mance, that is not really the question and the direction I was trying to get at. What I am trying to get an understanding here of is you are saying there is more funding needed there. I am not quite sure what has been funded now and how big the gap is. I am also trying to get a little bit of an understanding to—and this is sort of my follow up question, as to the type of funding you—have you got funding arrangements that say, "we will fund you to do x, y, z", and they are quite prescriptive? Or is it, "we will give you a little bit of a discretionary grant and you can go ahead and use it as you want". But these are things I am trying to unpack to get a better understanding of what the response is.

Ms Mance: So it is six consultations is it 10 activities per year?

Ms Veikkanan: So I am happy to take that on notice and respond really specifically. Because in—I know the Canberra environment into our contract does have some particular numbers. For example, 12 workshops and six consultations with government, et cetera. And then beyond that, a lot of it is responding to the volunteer demands and community needs and also the inbox that is full of questions—

Paula Mance, Executive Director, SEE Change: The answer to the Member’s question is as follows:

The table below details the requirements of the service funding agreement between SEE Change and the ACT Government (represented by EPSDD) for the provision of operational funding to support the provision of environment and sustainability services to the ACT community.

Objective*	Key Performance Indicator
1. Promote and distribute information relevant to ACT Government sustainability policies, initiatives, and sustainability priorities.	Information disseminated in various media such as newsletters, social media, meetings and/or emails to reach at least 1500 people
2. Engage the community through consultation, events and workshops that support individual, household and/or community action on ACT Government sustainability and environment priorities.	Conduct at least 12 consultations, events and/or workshops that meet one or more of the ACT Government’s sustainability and environment priorities.
3. Work with Government to develop and implement relevant environment, sustainability and climate change policies and programs.	Participate in at least 4 meetings with EPSDD to discuss key sustainability and environment policies and programs and provide quarterly reports against these measures. As is relevant to your organisation, make formal submissions to relevant ACT Government policy development and review process. Proactively bring to the attention of Government sustainability and environment challenges and opportunities.
4. Produce an annual work plan detailing the activities, KPIs and evaluation framework. Include communication plans and risk assessment process.	Provide annual work plan to EPSDD for approval by 30 August of each year of the agreement.
