How many times, in the past four years, have debt collectors/debt collection methods been used while an objection to a reassessed conveyance duty concession has been ongoing?

Ms Rachel Stephen-Smith MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:

A letter of demand is sent for each overdue debt whether under objection or not. Further actions are considered on a case-by-case basis.

The ACT Revenue Office does not collate the information requested in relation to the overall number of times debt letters have been produced while an objection has been raised. To produce it would require a review of all cases. This would be an unreasonable diversion of resources.
