In relation to: Performance and Development plans

THE CHAIR: Just to save our secretary some work, could I just put a question—could you take it on notice? Just a corporate question. Are all executives and above required to have a performance and development plan? And, if so, how many do not?

Mr Ponton: Short answer. Ben Ponton, Director-General, Environment, Planning, Sustainable Development. Yes, they are required to, and in terms of how many do not, I would like to think the answer is “none”, but I will take that on notice.

MINISTER ORR: The answer to the Member’s question is as follows:—

All Executives within EPSDD are expected to have a performance and development plan. Currently, 94% of Executives within EPSDD have a performance and development plan in place. One executive, currently on a temporary executive contract, does not yet have plan in place.
