Asked by Mr Michael Pettersson MLA:

In relation to:

ACTING CHAIR: How many members of the public have made a request through that JACS team for a camera?

Mr Burkevics: I do not have that exact number with me in terms of the request, those requests are lodged through the Fix My Street and other type communication mechanisms. I would not say they are frequent, but they do happen, an estimate would be probably under five a year.

ACTING CHAIR: Five a year. Can you take that on notice, just, I do not know, the last handful of years?

Mr Burkevics: Yes, absolutely.

MR MICK GENTLEMAN MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:–

In the past five years, JACS Security and Emergency Management Division received a total of 12 requests from members of the public in relation for the placement of CCTV cameras within the Public Safety Network. By calendar year, the number of requests received are:

- **2016:** One
- **2017:** Nil
- **2018:** Nil
- **2019:** Four
- **2020:** Four
- **January to June 2021:** Three.
