School infrastructure program and maintenance upgrades: does \$99 million over 4 include Garran; what is the allocation for each of those streams of that \$99 million; how much is there for thermal, for roofs, for inclusions; what is the allocation for the next financial year and also the forecast over the four years?

MINISTER BERRY The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

The funding for Garran Primary School Redevelopment is separate from the \$99 million School Maintenance and Infrastructure Upgrades program.
