Decision on your access application

I refer to your access application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (**FOI Act**), dated 3 August 2023, and received by the Office of the Legislative Assembly (the Office) on 9 August 2023.

This application requested access to:

- 1. Report *Mismanagement at the Motor Vehicle Registry* provided to all members of the Legislative Assembly about 1993;
- 2. Report to Wayne Berry, the then Health Minister in relation to shortcomings at Occupational Health and Safety the Injury Prevention and Management Unit 1995.

Authority

I am an information officer appointed by the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly to make decisions about access to government information, in accordance with section 18 of the FOI Act.

Decision

I have decided to refuse your access application under section 35(1)(b) of the FOI Act on the basis that the information sought is not held by our agency.

A search of the *Minutes of Proceedings* for the Second and Third Assemblies (1992-1997) did not find any reference to either of these requested documents, based on the information provided, being tabled in the Assembly.
