## Inquiry into referred 2019–20 Annual and Financial Reports and Budget Estimates 2020-21 ANSWER TO QUESTION TAKEN ON NOTICE 25 February 2021

Asked by Ms Orr, questions taken on notice by Ms Cameron.

In relation to: Gungahlin development forecasts

MS ORR: What was the horizon for those demand forecasts-

Ms Cameron: Sorry?

**MS ORR**: What was the timeframe for those forecasts, as in how many years forward were you looking?

Ms Cameron: It is going to be reviewed by 2024, so five years from the start of this.

MS ORR: Okay but is the forecast just for a five-year period or is it for longer than that?

Ms Cameron: I am not sure of that, I am sorry.

THE CHAIR: Would you like to take that on notice?

Ms Cameron: I can, yes.

MINISTER STEEL: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

The demand forecast is to 2028, with targets that comprise 13,500m<sup>2</sup> of existing offices (2016 value) and a further 21,500m<sup>2</sup> of future offices through growth of the town centre, mainly through small-scale offices.

The remaining 65,000m<sup>2</sup> is preserved for large scale commercial offices, as proposed in Draft Variation to the Territory Plan No. 364 (Gungahlin Town Centre).
