ANSWER TO QUESTION ON NOTICE

Asked by Mrs Nicole Lawder MLA: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services

Ref: Transport and City Services, Annual Report

In relation to: Mature Trees

- 1. Why has the creation of the draft action plan for mature trees taken three and a half years so far?
- 2. What measures have you put in place to ensure a more timely and efficient development of these action plans?
- 3. Has and will the Minister establish a loss of mature tree register or any other mechanism to monitor the loss of mature trees?
- 4. Approximately how many mature native trees have we lost to urban development over the past three and half years?

MINISTER VASSAROTTI - The answer to the Member's question is as follows:-

- During this time, the ACT landscape has been affected by major wildfires, floods and storms;
 This has had significant impact on mature native trees across the Territory requiring
 reassessment of the Action Plan. These factors, alongside workforce challenges with the
 COVID-19 health emergency, have impacted the Environment, Planning and Sustainable
 Development Directorate's timeframes.
- 2. The draft action plan for mature trees will utilise contemporary evidence and be a fit-for-purpose plan.
- 3. The draft action plan will consider a mechanism to monitor the loss of mature native trees.
- 4. The draft action plan will provide context around the number of trees lost due to a range of factors including urban development.
